





- 1. Article 1 from the Constitution
- 2. Stipulations from the Constitution
- The first article of the Constitution stipulates that Romania is a national, sovereign, independent, undivided and unitary state. The most important constitutive element is the nation. The nation is based on the ethnical, linguistical, traditional aspects of the community.

Romania is a sovereign and independent state because it doesn't depend on other nations. It is a single political structure and it has one constitution.

The power is being exercised at central level through its organs: legislative – Parliament; executive – President; judicial – Supreme Court.

Romania is an undivided state – it can not be divided nor fragmented, neither partially nor totally. It is characterized by a democratic political system. At an external level, Romania is part of the international system. It is republic.

- 2. a) The sovereignty belongs to the people.
- b) The Parliament is elected through universal, direct, equal and secret vote. It is the main representative institution.
- c) The President is elected through universal, direct, equal and secret vote and can only be dismissed by referendum.
- d) The Constitution concerns the protection of people's dignity, rights and liberties.


